

River Health Process

1. Identify and network with key stakeholders focused on Santa Clara – Utoom River Health including first responders, public safety officials, hospitals, safety net clinics, local county government, health plans, unhoused people, Community Benefit Organizations (CBOs), and Faith-Based Organizations (FBOs)
2. Form a planning committee of volunteers from step #1 for a series of stakeholder and community convenings on Santa Clara – Utoom River Health
3. The planning committee will develop a broad invitation list for convenings, including people with lived experience, and will develop a plan for setting up and running the convenings
4. Hold a series of stakeholder and community convenings on River Health with the following objectives:
 - strengthening community and stakeholder networking and collaborative capacity around River Health
 - performing asset mapping to determine where there are resources as well as gaps in resources for River Health
 - collaboratively designing solutions in response to the question, "How might we improve the Health of the River and the People living in it?"
 - testing design solutions via rapid cycle iteration in order to develop a business plan that will take successful designs to scale
5. Do 30 one-on-one interviews of stakeholders asking, "How might we improve the Health of the River and the People living in it?", in order to supplement and feed back into the previous convenings
